CENTER FUNDING

The Leon Senior Center operates on a very limited budget. We receive a mil levy from the county which is distributed through the Department of Aging. The amount received for 2022 was \$37,000.00. That amount dispersed quarterly, equals \$9,250.00 every 3 months or approximately \$3,083.00 per month. From this we pay our electric, gas, water and trash, telephone, yearly insurance premiums for work comp and liability, and payroll for custodian and director. All other funds for our center are acquired through fundraising including maintenance on our building and equipment and building insurance costing \$518/month. We raise money to pay for food which we serve Monday through Friday at noon. Our contract through the county requires us to prepare food daily when we are open while also packaging frozen meals for the county. Currently we have approximately 12 members who volunteer in preparation for every fundraising event, and those same people donate their time to ensure that our fundraisers are successful. We are up to approximately 340 members. My point being that we need to raise more money and also receive more volunteer help. Please consider joining those who are working tirelessly to keep our center open by donating your time and/or financial assistance. We are here for you and we are determined to keep the Leon Senior Center open. Our members should not have to struggle at this time in their lives to keep our valuable center alive. If you or any member of your family is interested in giving time, please call the center for the next opportunity! Any monetary donations will be greatly appreciated! Be the change you want to see!
